Draft

Answer seven focused prompts in your own words.

2

Build

Combine your sections into one editable essay.

Refine

Check flow, specificity, privacy, and length.

4

Submit

Protect the story - and the patient

Keep every event truthful. Remove patient names, dates of birth, exact locations, and other identifying details. The strongest essay is specific without compromising privacy.

Open with a moment

Choose one scene that reveals how you think, act, and connect with patients. A specific moment is more memorable than a summary of your entire life.

Build the scene

Where were you? What was happening? What did you notice, decide, say, or do? What changed in your understanding of patient care or the PA profession?

Coach's note: Use sensory or situational detail, but keep the spotlight on your choices and reflection - not on medical drama.

Opening draft

Connect experience to purpose

Admissions readers want to understand how your decision developed and why the PA role fits your values, skills, and experience.

Your path into patient care

Show progression

How did you seek meaningful patient-care experience? What responsibilities grew over time? How did you make patients feel heard, safe, or respected?

Coach's note: Focus on one or two turning points instead of listing every role from your resume.

Why PA - specifically

Go beyond the job description

What did you observe while working with or shadowing PAs? Which parts of the role match the way you want to practice, collaborate, and keep learning?

Coach's note: Your audience already knows what PAs do. Explain why the profession makes sense for you.

Turn qualities into evidence

Rather than naming strengths, show where they came from and how they shape the care you provide.

Skills you will bring

Claim + evidence + impact

Which two qualities best represent you? What specific situation proves each one? How did your communication, teamwork, adaptability, or judgment affect another person?

Coach's note: Choose examples that add new information instead of repeating your opening scene.

Service and community

OPTIONAL

Name the need - then your response

Have you worked with a community facing barriers to care? What did you learn from that community? How might that experience shape your future practice?

Coach's note: Avoid presenting yourself as a rescuer. Center respect, listening, partnership, and what you learned.

Own the context. Land the message.

Use optional context only when it helps the reader interpret your record. Then close by connecting your story, preparation, and future direction.

Academic context

OPTIONAL

Brief, accountable, forward-looking

If needed: What happened? What responsibility do you take? What changed? What evidence shows you can now manage the demands of PA school?

Coach's note: Do not spend valuable space explaining a minor issue that needs no explanation.

Conclusion

Return, reflect, look forward

What insight from the opening can you revisit? What is now clear about the PA you hope to become? Which contribution or commitment should stay with the reader?

Coach's note: End with earned confidence. Avoid introducing a brand-new story or simply repeating your resume.

Before you move on

Read it aloud. Check that each paragraph advances the same central story. Replace general claims with evidence. Remove repeated ideas. Confirm that no patient can be identified. Save a copy before closing the PDF.
